CLASSIFIER STRINGS				
String	Rounds	Start Position	Start Condition	Procedure
1	4	SP1	Standing upright, with firearm in the ready position, loaded and chamber empty (action must be closed and hammer down). BAS will start in the normal loaded condition, chamber(s) loaded.	On start signal, load and engage all targets. Reload when necessary.
2	4	SP2	Standing upright, firearm in the ready position and loaded with two rounds.	On start signal, engage all targets. Reload when necessary.
3	4	SP3a	Standing upright, firearm in the ready position and loaded with 4 rounds. BAS loaded to maximum capacity.	On start signal, engage two plates from SP3a then move to SP3b and engage remaining plates from low cover. Reload when necessary.
4	4	SP4	Standing upright with one's back to the targets, firearm unloaded on the drum. All loading devices/ammunition on the drum.	On start signal, turn, load, and engage all targets whilst remaining standing. Reload when necessary.
5	4	SP5	Standing upright, firearm in the ready position and loaded.	On signal, engage all targets. Reload when necessary.

Note: Unless otherwise detailed where the condition "loaded" is specified, firearms will be loaded with a maximum of 4 rounds. Break-Action Shotguns (BAS) will be loaded to their maximum capacity.

RANGE BUILDING NOTES	
1.	Distance between Threat Plate centers is 1m -0m +0.1m. Distance to the Non-Threat plate is 0.25m -0m, +0.05m
2.	The distance between front and rear plate arrays in each string is 3m with a tolerance of ±0.1m
3.	For clubs that do not have enough space to build all the strings on one range, the strings can be built on separate ranges as required.
4.	The strings are such that all strings can be shot using only five plates. However, this will require setting up each string in sequence with the consequence of increased time taken for each shooter.
5.	Plates to be used are 6" (152 mm) Square or Round Plates, with a stand that prevents the plate from rotating on the platform without it falling.
6.	The bottom of the plates is between 200mm and 1200mm from the ground depending on the stands available. However, all plates must be at the same height ±0.05m.
